
#### Deprivation

The Census measure of deprivation uses the following four dimensions:

**Employment** - Where any member of the household who is not a full-time student is either unemployed or long-term sick; **Education** - Where no member of the household has at least a level 2 qualification, and no member of the household aged 16-18 is a full-time student; **Health and disability** - If any member of the household has 'bad or very bad' general health or has a long term health problem; and **Housing** - The household's accommodation is ether overcrowded (with an occupancy rating -1 or less), is in a shared dwelling, or has no central heating. A household is classified as being deprived in one to four of of these dimensions in any combination.





